Here's a quick guide on what doesn't belong in our recycling yard. Please refer to this before you haul with us!

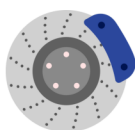
HAZARDOUS WASTE

Anything labeled hazardous under federal, state, or local law.



ASBESTOS-CONTAINING MATERIALS

Often found in old brakes, insulation, floor tiles, and electrical parts.



PCB ITEMS

Transformers, capacitors, light ballasts with PCBs.



APPLIANCES W/ REFRIGERANTS (CFCs)

Fridges, A/C units—okay only if CFCs* are removed or pre-approved.

*CFCs = Chlorofluorocarbons



ELECTRONICS

Computers, monitors, TVs, fax machines, printers, etc.



CYLINDERS/COMPRESSED GAS

Includes propane bottles unless de-valved or cut in half.



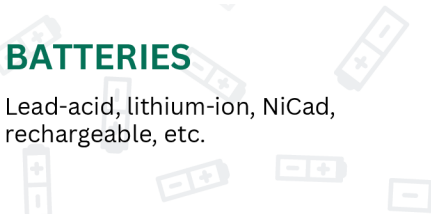
SEALED CONTAINERS

Propane tanks, fire extinguishers, oil filters, hydraulic cylinders, aerosol cans, barrels.



BATTERIES

Lead-acid, lithium-ion, NiCad, rechargeable, etc.



FLAMMABLE MATERIALS

Gas tanks, diesel tanks, solvents, oils, paints, kerosene, capacitors, varnishes



DIRTY DRUMS/TANKS/CONTAINERS

Must be 100% clean. No oil, grease, cleaner, or chemical residue.



OILY/GREASY MATERIALS

Engines, transmissions, oil filters, fuel tanks, hydraulic systems with hydrocarbons.



RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS

Pipes, gauges, or machines containing radioactive components.



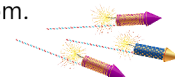
MERCURY-CONTAINING ITEMS

Thermostats, switches (non-auto), and devices with mercury.



EXPLOSIVE MATERIALS

Fireworks, ammo, or anything that goes boom.



NON-RECYCLABLE JUNK

Garbage, dirt, concrete, and trash that's just not metal.
